Ms. Maloney and Mr. Bruno:

Our firm, Edwards Cohen ("EC"), has been asked to represent Odyssey Charter School, Inc. ("Odyssey") in connection with the leasing by it of charter school facilities to be constructed by Building Hope ... A Charter School Facilities Fund (together with its affiliates, "Building Hope") for a new Odyssey Charter School campus in Melbourne, Florida. A brief description of this transaction is as follows: (i) Building Hope and others will form or acquire a limited liability company ("Owner," which will be an affiliate of Building Hope) to acquire an existing property in Melbourne, and will, on a phased schedule, renovate, develop and improve the property for use as a charter school facility (the "Project"); (ii) Owner will secure mortgage financing for the Project; and (iii) Owner and Odyssey will enter into a lease for the Project, with an option to purchase.

EC has represented Odyssey in connection with the acquisition and financing of certain of its existing charter school facilities, and in limited other matters. EC has represented Building Hope in the acquisition, development, financing and leasing of charter school facilities. EC continues to perform, legal work for each of Odyssey and Building Hope in unrelated matters.

EC's role in this instance will be to represent Odyssey with respect to the leasing of the Project. EC's representation of Odyssey will be "directly adverse to the interests of" Building Hope in this regard.

As all past or present legal representation of Building Hope by EC is unrelated to the Project, EC attorneys have no special or confidential information or knowledge of Building Hope related or relevant to this transaction which will not be disclosed by Building Hope to Odyssey, and because Building Hope will be separately represented by legal counsel with respect to this transaction, we reasonably believe that the representation of Odyssey with respect to this transaction will not be adversely affected by any past or present representation of Building Hope, and that our representation of Odyssey in this matter will not adversely affect our responsibilities to and relationship with Building Hope in unrelated legal matters.

We agree that if Building Hope and Odyssey become involved in a dispute involving the subject transactions that cannot be resolved without resort to litigation or other formal dispute resolution procedure, we will not represent any party named in this letter in such dispute.
