The teachers evaluated the scores by breaking down and deconstructing the essays during their PLC's and created an action plan. OPA FCAT Science scores were low last year. After review of the cold assessment scores this year, the school is predicting 64% proficiency. The OCS Jr./Sr. High has limited openings and the school is confident they will reach their goal of 450 students for the 2016-2017 school year.
