Uniform Policy

All Odyssey Charter School students are required to wear a school uniform. Our uniforms can be purchased through our uniform provider:

'Dress for Success' Guidelines: Students can choose from a green or white Odyssey t-shirt, polo, or dry-fit shirt, along with black or khaki bottoms.

- All students are required to wear khaki or black pants, shorts, skirts or 'skorts'. Inappropriately rolling or altering the pants in any way is in direct violation of the dress code. Shorts, skirts and 'skorts' length must be at least mid-thigh.
- Pants, shorts, skirts and 'skorts' that are too big or too tight, as determined by Administration, are not acceptable and will be deemed in violation of the uniform code. Joggers are allowed. Stretch pants, and athletic wear are not allowed. Students may wear solid color leggings under uniform shorts or 'skorts.'
- Belts must always be visibly worn. These belts must be black or brown and fastened securely at waist level. Pants must be worn at waist level. Loosely worn and lowly worn pants are not acceptable.
- Students must wear a collared polo shirt or t-shirt. Student polo's and t-shirts must be solid green or white. All shirts must bear the School Logo.
- Any attire and/or backpacks with any inappropriate logos or displays are prohibited.
- All hats, scarves, and bandanas are prohibited on school property.
- Shoes must be closed in the back. Flip-flops, slippers, or high heel shoes are prohibited.
- If a student chooses or needs to wear a jacket or sweatshirt due to cold weather, it must be a solid color and in accordance with the schools' uniform guide. Odyssey Elementary School students may choose solid black, gray, or navy sweatshirts. Jackets that are not in compliance with the uniform policy will be confiscated.

Bus Transportation

We would like to welcome Rosie Greer, as our new bus coordinator for our schools. Rosie will be helping with customer service and many other areas of our bus department. Odyssey Charter Schools provides bus transportation to students who live between two and four miles from the school – more miles might be allotted as per established bus routes. A bus slip must be completed for families who wish to sign up for bus services. Bus assignments will be available during summer registration. Each student is allowed one designated bus stop. Changes to assigned routes will not be permitted until a new registration form is completed by a parent/quardian with proper ID.

Before and After-School Enrichment Programs

Before-Care: OCS Elem Eldron: Before Care begins at 6:00am. Students participate in art, a variety of team-based games, and social fun. At 7:30am, students go to the café where they may enjoy a healthy breakfast for \$1.50. Registration forms are available in the front office of Odyssey Charter Elementary School. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The weekly rate for Before Care is \$35.00 per week and the daily drop-in rate is \$8.00 per day.

OPA Wyoming: Before Care begins at 7:00am. Students participate in art, a variety of team-based games, and social fun. At 7:30am, students go to the café where they may enjoy a healthy breakfast at no additional cost. Registration forms are available in the front office of Odyssey Preparatory Academy. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The weekly rate for Before Care is \$15.00 per week and the daily drop-in rate is \$4.00 per day.

After-Care: On both campuses, After Care is available to students until 6:30pm each day, and every student is provided a healthy snack. Students are grouped by grade levels and activities include art projects, outdoor recess and nature trails, digital learning, Yoga and Hip-Hop Dance instruction. Homework Help is provided when needed. Registration forms are available in the front offices of Odyssey Charter Elementary School and Odyssey Preparatory Academy. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The rate for After Care is \$55.00 per week, and the daily drop-in rate is \$12.00 per day

Before and After Care payments are due every Monday (via check or money order payable to OCS or OPA). Please place payments in the deposit box outside of the multi-purpose room at OCS or to the front office deposit box at OPA.

Positive Discipline in the Classroom

We are always working on developing the culture for learning at our schools. As we recommit in our elementary programs to "Positive Discipline in the Classroom" by Jane Nelsen, we are committing to the implementation of a model whose focus is to help build compassionate, resilient students who possess great communication skills. This method helps students develop the self-discipline needed to become excellent students. It helps to build a sense of community within the classroom by providing tools to develop respectful communication skills through a classroom meeting format. It helps students to treat each other in respectful ways. Its principles include helping students feel significant and that they belong, developing kind but firm teachers, teaching valuable social and life skills, and developing within students a sense of capability.

Grievance Procedures

Step 1: Request Teacher conference to clarify issue

Step 2: Contact Principal if unresolved with the teacher

Step 3: **Contact Board Designated Parent Representative

Step 4: Contact the President of the Governing Board

Step 5: Present issue at the next monthly Board Meeting if unresolved

Step 6: Seek mediation with the Sponsor

Gifted & Talented-Gateway Program

We are very excited for this upcoming school year and some of the new additions we are adding to the Gateway program at Odyssey Charter School. Our focus will be to use an integrated curriculum specific for Gateway students such as Project Lead that Way, Renzulli, and gifted curricula from William & Mary College. These curricula promote inquiry, problem solving, and logic. Some other skills that we will

integrate into this Acceleration block are group dynamics, self-advocacy and leadership. Our goal is to provide personalized learning opportunities that will foster growth and acceleration.

Acceleration Block

At Odyssey Charter School, teaching and learning are student-centered. The Acceleration block(s) is a specified period where all students have their learning "accelerated" forward. Acceleration involves the differentiation and personalization of instruction to address the needs and interests of each learner. This may appear in different forms across grade levels, but the goal is always the same, having each student reach their full potential.
