We are excited about the spring semester and are looking forward to finishing the year strong. Lots of exciting hands-on and engaging opportunities are taking place in classrooms across the school to ensure that all students are highly engaged and focused on their courses. Starting next week, students will be registering for exciting courses for next fall, which include new electives, such as PLTW biomedical engineering, ceramics, robotics, commercial art, and meteorology, as well as several new Advanced Placement and honors courses. In addition to these courses, the number of students participating in dual enrollment/early college continues to grow each semester and we now offer those courses on site. As a true college-prep school, we believe that all students will have a need for tutoring and/ or additional academic help at some time while at Odyssey. If your student needs additional help, consider having him/her come to before school tutoring (schedule posted in the healthy café) or Success Saturday from 9:00-11:00AM each week. In addition, if your student simply needs to make up an assignment, he/she can stay afterschool in Finish Friday from 3:00-4:00PM to complete any make-up work and/or tests. The Titan Learning Center (TLC) is also open as early as 7:30AM each morning for students that need to work on online or other computer-based assignments like iReady, Study Island, or Algebra Nation. If you need assistance in helping your student with an academic need, please reach out to our Academic Dean, Ms. Moore, and she will set up tutoring and/or intervention/acceleration for your Titan.

In addition to working diligently in our high-quality and rigorous courses, many of our students are also engaged in spring JV and Varsity athletics, like Basketball, Flag Football, Track, and Soccer, new clubs and extra-curricular activities, such as dominoes, eSports, Science Olympiad, Math Team, Interact, our spring musical, and more. BAND

After a successful fall semester, the Titan Band program is focusing on sound fundamentals, rhythm reading, and intonation. Several students have also been working on individual pieces to perform at the upcoming District Solo & Ensemble event at Viera High School. CIVICS

In 7th Grade Civics we are currently studying the requirements, process, and benefits of becoming a naturalized citizen. We have invited special guest speakers to talk about their personal experience in immigrating to our country. We will be welcoming Isadora Rangel of Florida Today who will discuss her journey when entering the United States.

We just finished our first community service project of the semester. In February 1st we had 38 students who assisted American Legion Post 117 with a fundraiser for Special Olympics. Our next project is scheduled for April 25th where we will be assisting State Representative Randy Fine with a food distribution for our community.

US HISTORY

In US History, we are working on political ideals from the early Republic period and the development of political parties. We are also supporting various classes whom have FSA, FCAT, and/or EOCs every Wednesday.

MATH

This past unit we have been working on learning about square and cube roots as well as the Pythagorean Theorem. We then went one step further and started using this information to solve real world problems. Have you even wondered how tall a tree is? Did you ever have to figure out the length of truss or it's slope? Did you ever wonder the distance to a place is as the crow flies? Your student can now do all those things! HOPE

Second semester of HOPE (Health Opportunities through Physical Education) is off to well-paced start as we get ready for our annual Odyssey Charter School 5K run which has been resceduled for May 16th. You may sign up your family at www.runningzone. com/events/odyssey-5k/



Students have been running twice a week at school, doing both long distance paced runs and faster paced interval training. If you enjoy running this is a great opportunity to compete and if you are not competitive this is a great opportunity to challenge yourself. As far as the classwork is concerned we have transitioned from fitness related content to more health related content. A few helpful reminders to finish the year strong are to make sure students have proper athletic footwear on our outside days and make sure students bring their own water bottle every day to stay properly hydrated.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Spanish courses are offered for both middle school and high school students from Beginning Spanish in 6th grade up to Spanish 3 Honors in high school. See the reasons that students want to learn and enjoy taking language courses here at Odyssey!

In addition to offering four different Spanish courses, we also provide students with the opportunity to take a language course online in the language lab. Students are able to work at their own pace and learn languages that are not currently offered face-to-face, choosing from French, German, Latin, Sign Language, or Chinese, starting with courses for students new to learning the language through the AP Level. Students work to expand their vocabulary, grammar and knowledge of cultural products and practices from countries around the world, while completing reading, listening, writing and speaking activities in the language, receiving feedback from a Florida-certified and highly qualified instructors.

COMP. SCIENCE III

This quarter, students are exploring Earth and Space Science in preparation of the FCAT. The unit started with the students exploring the solar system using Gizmos, a simulation application software program. We gathered data, calculated the mass (x10, mean radius and density of each planet. We then used that data to classify, analyze and compare the terrestrial planets to the gas giants. Students found it fascinating that Earth travels closer to the sun in January then in July because of its elliptical shaped orbit around the Sun. What makes this interesting is that Earth is colder in the Northern Hemisphere because the Earth is tilted away from the sun as it rotates on its axis. This is because the sun's radiation is concentrating on the Tropic of Capricorn at this time. It's the tilt of the Earth on its axis causes the seasons to differ in temperature.

ELA

Students are preparing themselves for standards mastery and the FSA this quarter through analysis of Holocaust Narratives. With five novels to select from, students are analyzing for theme and parallels. Additionally, students are practicing their higher-level cognitive functions by creating DOK questions (levels 3-6) to use as a discussion starter in their literature circles.

6TH GRADE

6th grade is focused on the Art of Learning HOW to think. We are actively engaged in learning about the 10 major types of logical fallacies and how to apply these methods for thinking, problem solving, and conflict management to historical issues, current events, and relevant social problems the student face. We are using the lessons in an age appropriate book designed for young teens called the Fallacy Detective.

8th Grade US History

8th Grade U.S. History continues to work on a number of academic skills including map reading, note-taking, and critical thinking through the use of multiple methodologies. We continue to strive to develop sound thinking and study skills that will continue to serve the students as they enter their high school years.

9th Grade World History

9th Grade World History classes are working on gaining greater understandings of various historical events and their effects on the people present. Some of these include Valley Forge and the French Revolution including the causes, courses, and consequences of those events. 10th Grade U.S. History and 11th Grade U.S. Government classes continue to work on improving critical thinking skills using course content as the vehicle for these efforts. This skill is reinforced through weekly essays and Socratic seminars. Both of these are designed to cause students to delve deeper into the content in order to create a greater understanding of the forces at work in impacting events and decisions.


Spelling Bee


