We have had a great start to a new school year and we remain honored to serve your children. We are happy to be back to the most important and sacred of work: educating students. Odyssey is very excited to report that in spite of a challenging school year, our students, teachers, and staff's hard work last year paid off. Although Odyssey Charter School (K-12) earned a school grade of "B", we are proud to share that our Elementary grades (K-5), had it been graded by the FLDOE separately, would have earned a school grade of "A"! Our school continues to be a high performing public charter school as defined by the Florida Department of Education.

We are also excited to share some new additions to our team this year to support students. Ms. Kayla Senick, Social Worker, Ms. Sarah-Kate Smith, Guidance Services, Ms. Bonnie Dubrow, Guidance Support, and Dr. Maxine Powell, Discipline Dean will be a vital part of our Social Emotional Learning Team to help support student behaviors to ensure learning takes place.

Our Gifted and Talented Education (GATEway) program has expanded this year and we have added an assistant to support Ms. Suzette Jewell Ventura. Ms. Rachel Gallegos Wirkkala has joined the GATEway team and will help Ms. Ventura provide experiences with William & Mary Gifted Curriculum, Junior Great Books, and additional Project Lead the Way (PLTW) modules. The Read Aloud program is a wonderful way for parents to fulfill their required annual volunteer hours while supporting their student's academic growth. In 1983, the U.S. Department of Education report "Becoming a Nation of Readers" found that, "the single most important activity for building the knowledge required for eventual success in reading is reading aloud to children."

We make it easy for parents to volunteer at our school by spending your time in the comfort of your own home with your child. To participate in the Read Aloud program, parents spend 15 minutes reading aloud quality literature to their child. Find a book that both you and your child will enjoy. Then log your time on the Read Aloud log which can be provided by your classroom teacher, or through the front office, or from the school's website. Next turn in your log at the end of each month to your classroom teacher or to the front office and you will receive volunteer hours for the time spent reading aloud to your child.

This tool or method was created to help people of all ages think in organized ways to problem solve, create and innovate.



- The white hat: Focuses on facts and logic.
- The red hat: Focusing on emotion and what the heart feels.
- The black hat: Focuses on negative outcomes or consequences.
- The yellow hat: Focuses on the positive outcomes.
- The green hat: Focuses on creativity and a new way of doing something.
- The blue hat: Focused on organization or a plan.

Tardy Policy

Student ID Badges

ClassLink

Odyssey Launchpad. Online Instructional Support

Family support of each child's education is critical to student success. Research shows that when parents are more involved, students do better! We are happy to share that elementary students (and parents) will have digital access to Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA), Savvas EasyBridge (enVision®), i-Ready, Studies Weekly, Study Island, Discovery Science, and Renzulli online programs to support instruction in the Florida Benchmarks through their single sign on through the Odyssey ClassLink Launchpad at https://launchpad.classlink.com/odysseyfl. Their username is their 7-digit student ID number (i.e. 1234567) and their password includes their birth date (i.e. OdyMMD-DYY).

- CKLA is our core Language Arts program that is rich in literature, history, geography and science. Your child has access to the CKLA content via the Launchpad and can read (or re-read) stories at home that they have learned at school.
- Our newly adopted math curriculum is enVision® Florida B.E.S.T. Mathematics. The curriculum is designed to help children gain a deeper understanding of mathematics through problem-based teaching and learning. Lessons are designed for students to explore each topic with hands-on materials, then two-dimensional pictures, and finish by connecting their thinking to symbols, numbers, and procedures.
- i-Ready provides individualized online instruction that targets each student's specific needs in both reading and math. Students take a diagnostic at the beginning of the school year to set their learning path and they work their path all year to fill in any gaps in learning or to advance themselves beyond their current level. Students are encouraged to utilize i-Ready for 45 minutes per week in each subject to progress toward their expected annual growth.
- Studies Weekly is a newspaper-based and online program supporting Social Studies instruction.
- Discovery Education Science provides science videos, articles and activities for students in science concepts and supports science instruction taking place in the classroom.
- Renzulli is an online program that all students have access to.
 Students take an interest inventory upon first using Renzulli, then engage in self-directed learning specifically matched to their individual profile. Renzulli places a strong emphasis on problem-solving, creativity and critical thinking skills to help ensure learners are developing thinking and reasoning skills that will prepare them for college and careers.

We encourage parents to take an active role monitoring students' progress on these programs, and to remind students to utilize these programs weekly. If you need support with any of the programs, contact your child's teachers or our instructional coaches.
