## Technology News Update

This year, we will be introducing some exciting new technology for our students. At our elementary school campus, we will be implementing a new mobile computer lab that will feature enough laptops for each student in a given class (offering a one-to-one student to computer ratio). In grades 4 - 6, students will have access to "Google Apps," an online suite of word processing, spreadsheets, and presentation software. And in grades 5 – 6, students will be

introduced to Cyber Citizenship and e-mail safety using Google's "walled garden" e-mail. This is a safe environment that allows students to communicate with teachers and peers, while blocking outbound and inbound e-mail from the outside world. At the junior / senior high school, students in grades 7-9 will also be offered the "Google Apps" suite with full access e-mail. Parents will be given the opportunity to "opt-out" of these programs if so desired.

This year, Odyssey Charter School will participate in a school-wide program with Microsoft Corporation that will offer our families the opportunity to download and install a fully-licensed version of Microsoft Office 2013 for the duration of your student's enrollment at OCS. More details on how to take advantage of this program will be announced after school starts.

## 1st and 2nd Grade Update

For the 2014-2015 school year, Odyssey Charter School will split the combined 1st and 2nd grade into single grade classrooms. The classrooms will remain co-taught by two teachers and will continue to be grounded in the philosophy and technique of Maria Montessori. This change will allow teacher teams to intensify instruction of the grade-level standards. Children will continue to have the opportunity to make choices and direct the path of their learning during daily afternoon work cycles. To support this transition, Ms. Nancy Keane, our veteran Montessori-certified early childhood teacher, will coach our Kindergarten through 3rd grade teachers on Montessori teaching methods.

## New Florida Standards and New Assessment



The new Florida Standards, Mathematics Florida Standards (MAFS) and Language Arts Florida Standards (LAFS), designed to help students become college- and career-ready by emphasizing analytical, critical thinking, and problem solving skills, were adopted in February, 2014. The Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS) will continue to be used for Science and Social Science instruction during the 2014-2015 school year. Odyssey Charter School teachers and staff are studying ways to provide high quality and rigorous instruction of the new standards in preparation for next school year.

In addition to new standards, a new assessment will take the place of the FCAT 2.0 next year. This test, called the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA), will require students to demonstrate their mastery of the standards in authentic ways, such as creating graphs to solve problems and interacting with multiple types of texts to prove comprehension. ## Jr/Sr High Electives

Depending on student interest, the following Jr/Sr electives are planned for this school year: Orchestra, Journalism, Writers Workshop, Psychology, Invention and Innovation, Science Research/Science Fair, Green Technology, Art, Speech/Debate, Spanish, Computer Skills, Keyboarding, Drama, Horticulture, Music Theory, Forensics, Robotics and Technology, Art 2D, Art 3D, Personal Fitness, HOPE, Critical Thinking/Study Skills, Aerobics, Career Research and Decision Making, Self Defense, Soccer, Anthropology, Track, Yoga, Basketball, Global Studies.

Due to some programming changes, some adjustments are being made to improve 7th – 9th grade electives. Students will be given an option of taking semester or year-long electives based on interest. Ms. Julie Chapman will be calling families of all students needing to select electives during the week of July 14th. Parents can also find the elective form on the website and drop it by the school Monday through Thursday from 9AM until 1PM. **Please note that students do NOT need to change selections if they are satisfied with their choices.** Students still needing electives in July 31 and August 1 will need to complete the elective form during registration. ## HOPE - Health Opportunities through Physical Education (HOPE)

During high school, students are required to take a course called HOPE. The purpose of this course is to develop and enhance healthy behaviors that influence lifestyle choices and student health and fitness. In addition to learning about physical fitness and health, students will engage in conversations about Nutrition and Wellness Planning, Diseases and Disorders, Health Advocacy, First Aid/CPR, Alcohol, Tobacco, and Drug Prevention, and Internet Safety.

## New High School Career Cluster - Business, Management, and Administration

OCS High School students will now have the option of entering a Business career cluster during the next school year. Career clusters are designed to integrate both the academic knowledge and technical skills needed for a wide range of occupations, allowing school graduates to pursue career opportunities from entry level through management and professional levels. They also focus on all aspects of an industry or cluster so that a learner gets exposed to a range of possible occupations and industry standards. As our school grows, we will be investigating more career clusters based on student interest and industry needs.

## Student Leadership Team

At the end of last year, the OCS Leadership team created a Jr/Sr High Student Leadership Team to help gather student input on ways to improve our school community. One of their suggestions was to create more clubs and as a result, teachers will work with students this year to develop more club and afterschool opportunities based on the mission/vision of the school. This year, we will continue to have student leadership meetings in the hopes of continuing this dialogue.



## Zero Robotics

Odyssey's Zero Robotics Middle School Team has blasted off to a great start. We kicked off the first week learning about space science, conducting rocket experiments, and learning the basics of the programming language used in manipulating the SPHERES satellites. Our team is excited to have more hands-on experiences beginning with a field trip to Kennedy Space Center on Tuesday, July 15. We will also visit with scientists at Florida Tech to learn aerospace and mechanical engineering that went into the development of the satellites aboard the ISS.

Our program integrates Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) and offers inspiration and opportunities for developing STEM interests and career possibilities.

Our team has shown commitment, enthusiasm, and dedication to working together and developing the skills needed to program the SPHERES satellites. Wish us luck in our quest and our competition with other Florida schools in early August! You may even be able to watch our team's program run on board the ISS in a live competition facilitated by astronauts!
