NEW! This year, our 6th grade students will take the Reading FCAT online as a computer-based assessment. Students will have opportunities to practice online prior to the test date.

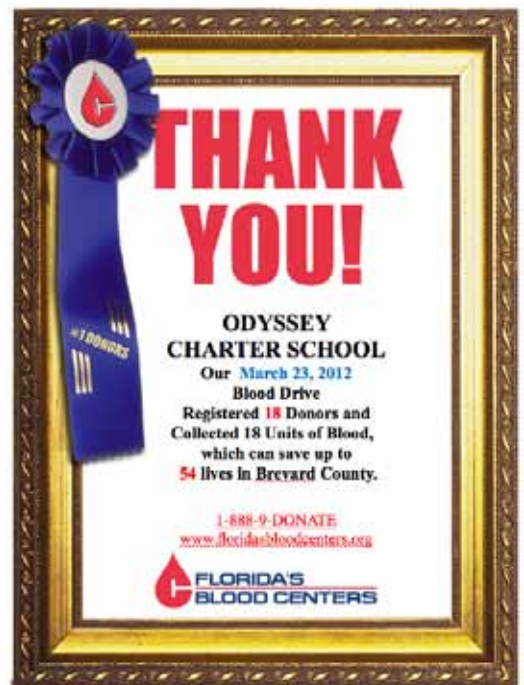

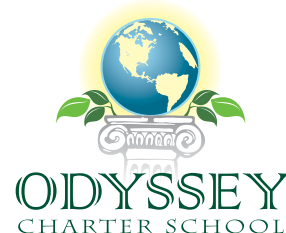
