COVID Information

Odyssey School Leaders in collaboration with Green Apple School Management have been working on our plan to ensure that our students and staff are able to return to campus and remain safe, clean, and healthy. We have organized our rooms and the cafeteria to allow for social distancing in all rooms to the degree practicable. We have procedures for checking temperatures for all students and staff, along with procedures and guidelines that we will follow if we have someone that gets sick. Our cleaning procedures have been reviewed and enhanced and we have hired additional staff to assist in keeping our campus clean and disinfected throughout the day.

Our schedules will allow for reduced student travel to decrease the intermingling of students throughout the day. Our cafeteria has been set up with students facing one direction, and with fewer students per table. For our departmentalized grade levels (4th and 5th), students will remain in their homeroom and teachers will travel to ensure we can continue to offer quality instruction in the safest way. Several of our Special Activity teachers will travel to the homeroom classrooms, eliminating extra student transitions during the day. Every classroom has already been organized with desks and/or tables to allow students to be successful while ensuring they remain healthy. We have also restructured our arrival and dismissal to decrease opportunities for groups of students to congregate in the main hallway and cafe.

We will continue to monitor the plan that Brevard Public Schools provides as well as the CDC guidelines for schools and will adapt as needed.

COVID Expectations – for sick students

If a student arrives to school with a temperature, or becomes sick during the day, they will be quarantined in a designated area of the clinic, required to wear a mask, families will be contacted, and the student is expected to be picked up immediately to eliminate exposure to other students or faculty members. A doctor note will be expected to allow for the return of the child to school. Students diagnosed with COVID-19 will be required to quarantine at home for up to 14 days and be released by their doctor.

School Visitors

Due to COVID-19 and current conditions, we will not have any school visitors, including family members, until later in the fall when it is determined to be safe. As the year progresses, we will continue to monitor and evaluate the school's health and safety conditions for our Titans and our school community. We thank you for your help and support in making sure the safety of all our students and staff continues to be our priority.

In our effort to follow CDC guidelines and social distancing we encourage you to allow plenty of time for final registration so that we can provide for social distancing. We ask that you bring your own pen to complete registration forms. Wearing a mask is optional but encouraged. We will clean and disinfect throughout the registration.

School Uniform Policy

'Dress for Success' Guidelines: Students can choose from a green or white Odyssey t-shirt, polo, or dry-fit shirt, along with black or khaki bottoms.

- All students are required to wear khaki or black pants, shorts, skirts or 'skorts'. Inappropriately rolling or altering the pants in any way is in direct violation of the dress code. Shorts, skirts and 'skorts' length must be at least mid-thigh.
- Pants, shorts, skirts and 'skorts' that are too big or too tight, as determined by Administration, are not acceptable and will be deemed in violation of the uniform code. Joggers are allowed. Stretch pants, and athletic wear are not allowed. Students may wear solid color leggings under uniform shorts or 'skorts.'
- Belts must always be visibly worn. These belts must be black or brown and fastened securely at waist level. Pants must be worn at waist level. Loosely worn and lowly worn pants are not acceptable.
- Students must wear a collared polo shirt or t-shirt. Student polo's and t-shirts must be solid green or white. All shirts must bear the School Logo.
- Any attire and/or backpacks with any inappropriate logos or displays are prohibited.
- All hats, scarves, and bandanas are prohibited on school property.
- Shoes must be closed in the back. Flip-flops, slippers, or high heel shoes are prohibited.
- If a student chooses or needs to wear a jacket or sweatshirt due to cold weather, it must be a solid color and in accordance with the schools' uniform guide. **Odyssey Elementary School students may choose solid black, gray, or navy sweatshirts. Jackets that are not in compliance with the uniform policy will be confiscated.**

Bus Transportation

In preparation for the upcoming school year Odyssey Transportation is excited to announce we are now working with 3DEZROUTING!! Parents/guardians will be able to update any address changes that might alter a student's bus route through this website. We are happy that this will assist us in keeping you better informed throughout the school year.



Registering your student for school bus transportation will now be handled online for easy access, and the school will be able to provide you with updates on your student's application as well as information on their assigned bus and route. We will also be able to send you important information with any transportation changes or updates that might affect your student throughout the school year.

Registration is required for ALL (new and returning) school bus riders to ensure that your student is routed and assigned to the closest bus stop available. Bus transportation is available for students whose residence is located over two miles from the school they attend. Please register on our transportation website as a parent/guardian, using this link: <https://www.ezrouting.com/odysseyfl>.

You will need the following information to register:

1. Your student's name.
2. Student District ID for Brevard. (The same ID used in BPS Focus)
3. Your student's current physical address.
4. Current Parent/Guardian home and/or cell phone numbers.
5. Current Parent/Guardian email address.

This information will only be used for transportation routing and communication purposes, so accuracy is important.

Odyssey Charter Schools provide bus transportation to students who live between two and four miles from the school (some farther than 4 miles). Bus registration is online this year and computers will be available during summer registration. **Each student is allowed one designated bus stop.** Changes to assigned routes or bus transportation needs will not be permitted until a new registration form is completed by a parent/guardian with proper ID.

Odyssey's Transportation Department will operate in accordance with CDC Guidelines We thank you in advance for your cooperation in keeping our children safe and healthy. Please take the time to review and discuss the following safety procedures and expectations.

- Students are encouraged to practice social distancing at their assigned bus stops.
- Students are encouraged to wear an optional mask during bus routes.
- Students will use hand sanitizer as they enter and exit the bus.
- Any students with an elevated temperature will be seated in the designated area in the front, parents will be contacted, and students will need to be picked up from the school.
- Siblings will sit together during all routes.
- Students will exit the bus one row at a time from front of the bus to the back of the bus, during arrival to the school in the morning.
- Be mindful and practice good hygiene and manners.

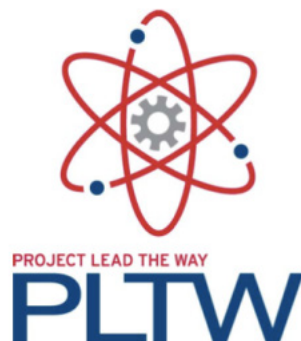
Gifted and Talented- GATEway Program

We are very excited for this upcoming school year and some of the new additions we are adding to the Gateway program at Odyssey Charter School. Our focus will be to use an integrated curriculum specific for Gateway students such as Project Lead that Way, Renzulli and project-based learning for all of our Gifted and Talented students. Some additional skills that will be integrated into our GATEway program are group dynamics, self-advocacy and leadership. Our goal is to provide personalized learning opportunities that will foster growth and acceleration.



Project Lead the Way Program

This year we are pleased to announce that we will be integrating Project Lead the Way (PLTW) activities into our Special Activity Rotation, which will be a hands-on project-based class for all students. The PLTW curriculum promotes inquiry, problem solving, and logic. We have a new teacher, Jeannette Russell, that will join our Special Team and work on the PLTW projects with all our students throughout the school year.



Acceleration Block

At Odyssey Charter School teaching and learning are student-centered. Our acceleration block is a set period each day where all students have their learning "accelerated." This involves differentiation and personalization of instruction to address the needs and interests of each learner. Acceleration may appear different across the grade levels, but our goal is always the same, supporting each student as they reach their full potential.

I'm open to your feedback. Help make me better.

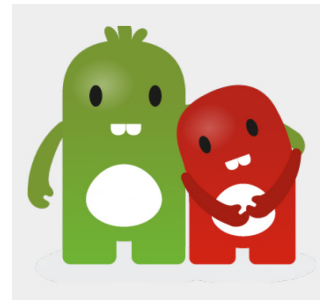
You are not alone.

Enrichment Before and After School Programs

Before Care at OCS Elem Eldron Campus: Before Care begins at 6:00am. Students participate in art, a variety of team-based games, and social fun. At 7:30am, students go to the café where they may enjoy a healthy breakfast at no additional cost. Registration forms are available in the front office of Odyssey Charter Elementary School. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The weekly rate for Before Care is \$35.00 per week and the daily drop-in rate is \$8.00 per day.

Before Care at OPA Wyoming campus: Before Care begins at 7:00am. Students participate in art, a variety of team-based games, and social fun. At 7:30am, students go to the café where they may enjoy a healthy breakfast at no additional cost. Registration forms are available in the front office of Odyssey Preparatory Academy. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The weekly rate for Before Care is \$15.00 per week and the daily drop-in rate is \$4.00 per day.

After Care on both campuses: After Care is available to students until 6:30pm each day, and every student is provided a healthy snack. Students are grouped by grade levels and activities include art projects, outdoor recess, homework time, digital learning and Hip-Hop Dance instruction. Registration forms are available in the front offices of Odyssey Charter Elementary School and Odyssey Preparatory Academy. There is a one-time registration fee of \$25.00 per family. The rate for After Care is \$55.00 per week, and the daily drop-in rate is \$12.00 per day.

Before and After Care payments are due every Monday (in the form of a check or money order payable to OCS or OPA) to pre-pay for the week. Please place payments in the deposit box outside of the multi-purpose room at OCS or to the front office deposit box at OPA.

** Registrations are based on a first come, first serve basis in the order they are received. If maximum capacity is reached, your child may be on a Wait List until a placement becomes available. **

** All 19-20 Before & After Care outstanding balances must be paid in full in order to participate in 20-21 Before & After Care. **

- Step 5: Present issue at the next monthly Board Meeting if unresolved
- Step 6: Seek mediation with the Sponsor
